- 1 Timothy 1:15-16

- Communion is meant to be a shared experience

- > God knows our hearts and cannot be mocked
 - I must not be selfish or 'fake' fellowship

~ LIFEGROUP STUDY QUESTIONS ~

OPENING DISCUSSION: Describe what dinner time was like during your teen years (Who sat where? Who was in charge of setting the table or clearing the dishes? Was anyone known for eating too much or too little? Any family rituals? Etc.)

READ 1 Corinthians 11:17-26.

- > If you had been there, what would you have seen, heard, and felt as the Corinthians observed the Lord's Supper?
- > How was Communion being distorted in Corinth as compared to its original intent?
- > Why does Paul repeat the account of the Lord's Supper in his letter? (REFER to Luke 22:14-20 also)

READ 1 Corinthians 11:27-34.

- > What does Paul mean by eating and drinking in "an unworthy manner"?
- > How do we not "discern the body of Christ"?
- > What kind of "self-examination" is Paul talking about?
- > Remembrance (v24-25), proclamation (v.26), and participation (10:16) are three realities of Communion. How would you explain to a non-believer how the Lord's Supper accomplishes each of these?
- > Discuss any ways that our communion services could be more inclusive?

PRAY that communion would remind us of our need for Christ and also of our need for one another as the Church Body. Also, pray for any needs in your group and continue to encourage one another in their faith.
