## I. PEOPLE ARE \_\_\_\_\_

- > When the Holy Spirit fell on them at Pentecost, \_\_\_\_\_ was filled.
  - Acts 2:1-4

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- Acts 2:17, 18

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- Acts 2:39

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> It was the very message that everyone was longing to hear ... and that we are longing to hear today.

- Acts 2:21
  - Everyone is \_\_\_\_\_ and can be forgiven.
  - You are precious in the eyes of God ... His lost treasure that is now restored to him!

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- Acts 2:4
  - In the Body of Christ, everyone is included and \_\_\_\_\_ by the Holy Spirit.

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- > In the Kingdom of God, there is no exclusion or discrimination.
  - Revelation 5:9

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> The body of Christ needs to be a \_\_\_\_\_ of the welcoming, including, and accepting place where King Jesus resides.

## II. PEOPLE ARE \_\_\_\_\_ FOR

- > The early church made sure that they took care of each other.
  - Acts 4:32-35
    - "And \_\_\_\_\_ was so powerfully at work in them all that there were no needy persons among them." (vs. 33b-34a)
    - And people noticed!

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> \_\_\_\_\_ is a defining characteristic of the church.

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- > It shows the world that our God is a \_\_\_\_\_ God.
  - It is a small taste of when God will completely satisfy our every longing.

## III. PEOPLE ARE \_\_\_\_\_ TO EACH OTHER

- > There are many barriers that separate people from one another.
- > The challenge for the early Church was that all sorts of people, from all sorts of backgrounds, were being saved.
  - Acts 2:41 – 3000 people were added to their number
  - Acts 2:47 – "... the Lord added to their numbers daily those who were being saved".
    - slaves, free, rich, poor, men, women
    - Jews of different traditions
    - Gentiles (Acts 10:44-46)

- > We are called to be united \_\_\_\_\_ our differences.  
• 1 Corinthians 12:12-14; Galatians 3:26-28; Colossians 3:11
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> Not only does the body of Christ encompass people who are different from each other but there must be unity between people who have a history of animosity between each other.

- We are not called to \_\_\_\_\_. We are called to unity!

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> The Spirit brings reconciliation between divided people groups.

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> This is the preview of life with King Jesus that people need to see in us: People who might normally be at odds with each other are now loving each other and living together in Christ.

### CONCLUSION:

The Church is the body of Christ. So, the Church is the main way that our world will understand who Jesus is, what is important to him, and how he relates to people.

The world needs to see through our example that King Jesus' arms are wide open to \_\_\_\_\_ all who call on him, that King Jesus is the ultimate \_\_\_\_\_ of all our deepest needs, and that King Jesus \_\_\_\_\_ us to God and to each other.

## ~ LIFEGROUP STUDY QUESTIONS ~ (adapted from the Serendipity Bible for Groups)

**OPENING DISCUSSION:** From where did your ancestors emigrate? What did their new citizenship mean to them? Or, if you have recently immigrated to Canada, what does this mean to you? Discuss what it means to be a citizen of a country.

### **READ & DISCUSS** EPHESIANS 2:11 – 22.

- > Before Christ, what problems did the Gentiles face?
- > What results from being “in Christ”?
- > What is the bomb that Jesus dropped on the religious “class system” of his day?
- > What impact would verses 14-18 have on the divisions between Jews and Gentiles?
- > How is the reconciling work of Christ (vv. 19-22) like new citizenship? Like a new family? A new temple?
- > Reading Peter’s words from v.38-40, what is required? What is promised?

### **REFLECT AND SHARE:**

- > What relationship in your life still has walls to be knocked down? How will that happen?
- > Although God’s grace is personal (Ephesians 2:8), what social barriers should it be affecting in our community? Our church?
  - What could your role be in that process?
