Story Time

Read 'The Warrior Leader' (pages 108-115 in the Jesus Storybook Bible) or watch the video on our website.

Understanding the Story

Talk this through with your kids:

In our last story, 10 ways to be perfect, God's people were following Moses. While following Moses, the people hadn't fully trusted God. God showed them the land He'd promised them, but all they did was grumble and worry. They refused to follow God's instructions! So instead of living in that land, they wandered the desert for 40 years (that's a long time!) until it was time for a new leader - Joshua.

God asked Joshua to do something that maybe seemed a little unusual...but Joshua was obedient (that means he did as he was asked) and followed God's instructions. Have you ever heard of anyone winning a battle by walking in circles, shouting and playing trumpets?! But Joshua wasn't asked to fight, he was asked to trust God and follow Him, and he did just that! God rescued his people from years of wandering in the desert and he gave them a home. We can trust that God will save us too. All we have to do is follow His instructions to believe Jesus is our Rescuer and follow Him.

Digging a little deeper:

It's important to remember that Joshua wasn't the perfect leader either. The perfect leader will come later, the true rescuer, Jesus. But Joshua led God's people as best he could, and even though they still made mistakes, those mistakes point us back to Jesus and the fact we need a rescuer.

Questions to get you talking:

- Think of some places you might find instructions (Example: Lego kits!)

Digging a little deeper:

Point again and again to God's GRACE.

Grace is something that's given without being earned. That even though we don't deserve to be saved because of all the wrong we do, God still saves us anyway.
